HISTORY OF OTYOKWA LODGE

The Otyokwa Lodge was organized in the Chippewa Valley Council in 1946 to stimulate a high standard of camping and to retain the interest of older Scouts.

The original flap patch of Otyokwa Lodge was white with the flying eagle outlined in red. The Lodge totem was adopted by the Lodge at the 1953 conclave. The Lodge presented the first Eagle Claw Award at the Lodge's winter banquet in 1955.

The Lodge has been well represented at every Area and National Conference. Several persons in our Lodge have been officers on the Area and National level. James Kolka was Area Chief in 1955-1956, and was National Conference Chief in 1958. Jerry Krogman was Area Chief in 1964-1965.
